- cotton or polyester bobbin thread










Tips from Kati:

	White interfacing fabric (white cotton fabric) Batting: (use your favourite kind). (If you are doing the cushion)	1 pc	large enough for the flowers 50 cm x 50 cm (20" x 20")
	Cream background fabric. Cream backing fabric. (For the cushion only.)	1 pc 1 pc	50 cm x 50 cm (20" x 20") 50 cm x 50 cm (20" x 20")
	Tear away or iron on stabilizer.		Large enough for the flowers.
	Burgundy and red for the <b>poppies</b> .		Large enough to cover the patches.
	Darker and lighter blue for the <b>cornflower</b> .		Large enough to cover the patches.
	White and yellow for the <b>dasies</b> .		Large enough to cover the patches.
	Medium green and dark green for the <b>green leaves</b> .		Large enough to cover the pieces.
	Light green for the <b>background square</b> . (Only for the cushion.)		Large enough to cover the pieces.
	Yellow and black for the bumble bee.		Large enough to cover the pieces.
